I am teaching school in the Liberty community in Kemper Co. It is very rural but better than doing nothing of course. It seems like a nice community and I have a good boarding place. Another teacher boards here, a Miss Light, I like her all right. There is another, who is supposed to board here. She lives in Meridian and went home tonight. I reckon she is going to come back tomorrow. We just had the formal opening today. I imagine it will be next week before we really get down to work if we ever do.

The Wilkinsons, the people with whom I board, seem real nice. We have good food etc. but I imagine it will

be lonesome. Especially as they
say the roads sometimes
become impassible in the winter.

The Ellards (Aunt K.C., Mac,
and twins) were at home when I
left. The brats had just about
run the whole family crazy.

I guess Mothers and Martha
have written you all the news
from home and there is none
here.
